COVID-19 Outbreak Update #4 | Confinement Measures during State of Alarm for Health Reasons

14 April 2020

In accordance with data provided by Equatorial Guinea's Ministry of Information, a meeting of the Political Committee for the Surveillance and Fight against the Coronavirus (*Comité Político de Vigilancia y Lucha Contra el Coronavirus*) took place on 13 April 2020.

The meeting was called by the Vice President of Republic of Equatorial Guinea (that heads said Committee) further to a first COVID-19 case by local contagion being diagnosed in the capital city Malabo.

During the Committee's meeting it was decided to strengthen the measures to contain the spread of the COVID-19 outbreak, including that:

- Save for public and private administration officials, as well as supermarkets, grocery stores and pharmacies of all districts of the Insular Region, the population of said Insular Region must remain in strict confinement during the 48 hours following the meeting;
- · Shops and factories will stay closed;
- The captain and crew members of trade ships will be tested for COVID-19; and
- Masks will be distributed for free to the population by the Government and their use is mandatory.

State Order, Defence and Security Officials will be in charge of making sure that these measures are complied with.

The Vice President of the Republic indicated that these measures will be adopted by a Government's Order.

We plan to continue issuing updates on the measures put in place in the Country.
